Larger Than Life

LOTS 1-194

An old friend and industry insider kindly consigns the following 194 lots, here for eager bidders. The wines below represent a large collection of New World classics and pristine Bordeaux along with some standout Italians, many in magnums and beyond. All in all, nearly 300 large formats made the journey to our auction room to meet new homes.

A highlight here is the wide range of Screaming Eagle in various formats. Ranging from the rare Sauvignon Blanc to the “entry level” (which bests many a Napa flagship) Second Flight to the classic Cabernet that changed the game since its inaugural vintage in '92. The allure of “Screaming E” hasn't wavered in over thirty years and if anything, the wines continue gaining acclaim with each vintage. Not to be missed either are Harlan magnums and double magnums ranging from 1995 to 2017.

From Italy, an incredible half case of '85 Sassicaia and massive amounts of Masseto lead the charge. The Classified Growths are well represented along with a smattering of Super Seconds.

This collection was removed from professional storage in the Mid-West where it was kept under temperature and humidity control. Many of the wines were purchased on or near release. There will be further selections from this cellar in an upcoming online sale, open November 18th, as the consignor's collecting interests run both broad and deep.

Jacky Truchot

Classic Burgundy, the term that embodies wines that were created underneath Jacky Truchot; fragrant, pure, and elegant are the words that describe his masterfully vinified product. Truchot's style was textbook, no filtration, minuscule amounts of new oak, 100% destemmed, absolutely no cold soaking, and as high of a yield as the AOC allows. Jacky Truchot closed a chapter of Burgundy history in 2005, setting off a scramble for collectors who appreciate the clean style of classic Burgundy.

Perched on the exquisite rolling, sun-filled, hills of Chianti, Solaia and Tignanello produce two of the finest wines in Italy today. Both estates were founded on the notion of marrying the traditional winemaking practices with new varietals, staying true to quality and tradition, and continuing the quest for excellence through innovation. Debuting the groundbreaking Tignanello in 1971, Piero Antinori sought to convey the elegance and versatility of the noble Sangiovese grape by blending it with non-traditional Cabernet Sauvignon and Cabernet Franc, and omitting the traditional white grapes used in the production of Chianti. The subsequent release of Solaia (first, in 1978 as a limited release and then officially in 1979), was born of a similar innovative spirit and eventually emerged as the estate's most esteemed blend of Cabernet Sauvignon, Sangiovese and Cabernet Franc.

Sassicaia

Tenuta San Guido is named after the Saint Guido della Gherardesca who lived during the eleventh century. It is located on the Tyrrhenian coast, between Leghorn and Grosseto, in Maremma an area made famous by Italian Nobel prize winner Giosuè Carducci, and it stretches for 13 km from the sea to the hills. Three are its defining characteristics: the Sassicaia wine, the Razza Dormello-Olgjata thoroughbred studfarm and the Bird Sanctuary Oasi di Bolgheri. They divide the estate between the Oasi on the coast, the horse's training grounds on the plain, and the vineyards planted up to 350 meters on the hills. The latter have been given their own DOC, the DOC Bolgheri Sassicaia, the first, and so far only case in Italy of a DOC contained in one estate. The wedding of Mario Incisa della Rocchetta and Clarice della Gherardesca on October 18th 1930, started it all. They shared a love for thoroughbred horses that made them form a partnership with horse breeder and trainer Federico Tesio. Mario Incisa's love of good wine made him plant Cabernet vines in 1942 for what was to become Sassicaia. Seventeen years later the Oasi di Bolgheri becomes Italy's first Italian private nature preserve. In 1966 it is, with the Oasi of the lake of Burano, the first WWF Wildlife Refuge in Italy.

Caymus

Caymus Vineyards was founded by Charlie Wagner only in 1972, but the Wagner family had a long previous history of winemaking and viticulture in the area. Their first bulk winery was built in 1915, and after the end of Prohibition the Wagners purchased 73 acres of prime Rutherford land to grow grapes for sale and home winemaking.

In 1972, Charlie, his wife Lorna and their son Chuck founded Caymus Vineyards, named for the original Mexican name of the Rutherford area, Rancho Caymus. Their first vintage included 240 cases of Cabernet Sauvignon, and by 1975 they were so pleased with the quality of the fruit from their vineyards that they chose the best for extended barrel aging and gave it the name "Special Selection." This cuvee is widely regarded as one of the best Napa Cabernets and is the only wine twice to be awarded the title of Wine Spectator's "Wine of the Year." Today, the winery remains in family hands, with Chuck Wagner in charge of all winemaking and viticulture.

Harlan Estate, owned by Bill Harlan, is a luxury, world-class, Cabernet Sauvignon-based wine produced from a steep, terraced vineyard on the western side of Napa Valley, high above Napa's famous Martha's Vineyard. Approximately twenty-four acres are in vine and the yields to date have been very low. Bill Harlan, better-known as one of the principals of Merryvale Vineyards...has only one objective: to produce one of the greatest red wines of California.

The wines are a blend of approximately two-thirds Cabernet Sauvignon and the remainder Cabernet Franc and Merlot. Bob Levy, Merryvale's winemaker and Michel Rolland, the well-known Bordeaux oenologist, are the architects behind these exceptional efforts. Stylistically the wines are the Napa Valley equivalent of a hypothetical La Mission Haut-Brion/Cheval Blanc blend. They are rich, powerful wines with unmistakable elegance, complexity, and purity.

Domaine d'Auvenay is the personal domaine of Lalou Bize-Leroy. When we think of Domaine Leroy, we think of tiny quantities of some of Burgundy's greatest wines. At Domaine d'Auvenay the quantities are microscopic, the quality just as high. The estate's entire holdings are around just four hectares. Even by top end Burgundy standards it is tiny. However since she first established the Domaine in 1989 it has gone on to become the stuff of legend among Burgundy collectors and connoisseurs the world over.

These are ultra-rare and the best of the best, no serious cellar is complete without them.

One will notice that many perfectly stored bottles from Domaine d'Auvenay will have assessment notes of signs of seepage. This is due to the fact they are overfilled at the domaine and are not an indication of poor storage conditions.

Marcel Guigal - perfectionist, fanatical, pernickety – is the super-star of the appellation and probably sells more Côte-Rôtie under his own label than all the other growers combined. Despite this size, however, the quality is exemplary - as they should be at the prices he charges! He harvests late, insists on very low yields, and keeps the wines in a combination of barrel and small foudres and demi-muids, all newish wood, for up to three and a half years before bottling. Their wines are so concentrated they can withstand this wait without drying out, and remain profound, rich and individual. La Landonne is the Brune, La Mouline the Blonde, La Turque the sort of hermaphroditic mixture. Usually my favourite is the Landonne. The Château d'Ampuis bottling combines elements of both the sectors of Côte-Rôtie, from vines in the climats of La Pommier, Le Pavillon, La Garde and Le Clos.

Proprietor Jayson Woodbridge makes some of the most unique, deeply personal wines in Napa Valley. Very late harvests and minimal intervention in the cellar, including no rackings until bottling, are just some of the choices that inform these wines. Woodbridge's vineyards are in St Helena (Kayli Morgan), the lower part of Howell Mountain (Ark) and Calistoga (Few and Far Between). Woodbridge is less reliant on outside consultants than many of his colleagues, so the wines bear very specific signatures that are unlike those of other wines being made in the Valley. The late harvests give the wines super-ripe fruit that can at times veer towards sweetness, but it is the extreme silkiness and finesse of the tannins that differentiates these wines. Woodbridge believes wines must be ready to go upon release and frowns upon decanting or advance aeration, which he doesn't think should be necessary. As outstanding as these wines can be upon release, the reality is that the wines have also proven to age exceptionally well.

The story behind these and the rest of the remarkable Marcassin wines began in the 1980s...At the time, Turley and Wetlaufer were two Burgundy lovers residing in Napa Valley who knew that they wanted to focus on Chardonnay and Pinot Noir. Early on, a friend suggested a long shot -- if you want to make great Pinot Noir, try the Sonoma Coast. "We knew it was a wonderful site," says Wetlaufer, now fifty four, recalling the first time he and Turley (also fifty-four) laid eyes on what is now their Marcassin Vineyard. Appropriately enough, the vineyard's name means "young wild boar" in French...

In the end they decided to follow their hearts, and in 1986 they borrowed \$65,000 from Wetlaufer's mother to buy forty acres on a rugged ridge about ten miles north of the mouth of the Russian River. In 1987 they began to prepare the steep, rocky, southeast facing slope's soil for planting. In 1991 they planted the first of what today are fourteen acres of grapevines, with a 50-50 mix of Chardonnay and Pinot Noir. The vineyard sits at an altitude of 1,100 feet...

Turley has had striking across-the-board success with different wines from different vineyards. Her work ranges from the plush, enormously rich Bryant Family and Colgin Cabernets to the immense Turley Zinfandels to the elegant, concentrated Landmark Chardonnays. The fact that bottlings from each of these wineries are now considered among California's elite is testimony to her talents as a winemaker.

Her winemaking philosophy is simple but strict: Find great vineyards, farm them precisely, limit crops, make sure the grapes ripen fully (even if it leads to higher sugar levels than many winemakers prefer) and ferment using natural yeasts. "What you have," says Turley, "are grapes from different vineyards, all made the same way, by the same winemaker, using the same techniques, the same barrels. If they taste different, the taste is terroir."

Size is also essential to the Marcassin formula. "We knew we wanted to be small -- that allows us to have total control," she says. The perfect size, she says, is 100 barrels, enough for 2,500 cases. Eventually, the fourteen acres of Marcassin grapes will produce forty tons of grapes -- roughly 2,500 cases. For the time being, Marcassin's wines are made at the Martinelli winery in Russian River Valley. In the near future, Turley and Wetlaufer hope to add another five acres of vines, along with a winery...

Opus One

Opus One was founded in the 1970s as a joint venture between Robert Mondavi and Baron Philippe de Rothschild (of Château Mouton Rothschild). A blend of two wine-making cultures as well as two of the most influential figures in the wine world, Opus One is modeled after a Bordeaux château but set in Napa Valley. Its inaugural vintage was produced at the Robert Mondavi Winery in 1979 and was unveiled alongside the 1980 vintage as the winery's first release. With this initial offering to the market in 1984, Opus One established itself as America's first ultra-premium wine and created a new category of American wine priced \$50 and above per bottle. In the 1980s and 1990s Opus One went on to become one of the elite producers of Cabernet – while the label does not identify a varietal, the wine is mostly Cabernet Sauvignon with some Cabernet Franc. Since its founding, Opus has added vineyard land in Oakville and now owns nearly 140 acres of vines, including some in the prized To-Kalon vineyard. Notable not only for its pedigreed lineage, Opus is also recognized for its monumental winery that some consider a tribute to its founders. Today Opus One is overseen by Baroness Philippine de Rothschild and produces approximately 25,000 cases a year.

When Jess Jackson brought Bordelais winemaker Pierre Seillan to California in 1998, he believed he had high enough quality vineyards to produce Bordeaux-quality wines with strikingly Californian personalities. He put Mr. Seillan in charge of three separate Vérité cuvees: La Muse, La Joie and Le Désir. La Muse is a Pomerol-styled wine largely based on Merlot blended primarily with Cabernet Franc and Malbec. La Joie was meant to be a Médoc-styled blend of approximately two-thirds Cabernet Sauvignon and the balance Merlot and sometimes tiny percentages of Malbec, Cabernet Franc and Petit Verdot. The third offering, Le Désir, was the St Emilion-styled wine, usually composed of about fifty percent Merlot and the rest lots of Cabernet Franc and a tiny amount of Cabernet Sauvignon. His foresight was realized when in a historic moment, wine critic Robert M. Parker, Jr., of The Wine Advocate recently announced seven 100-point scores for Vérité's three blends, Le Désir, La Joie and La Muse. This is the first time a Sonoma County winery has received this many perfect scores.

THE DEVOTION OF GUILLON (LOTS 562-574)

Former pilot of the French military, Jean-Michel Guillon, retired his illustrious career of service to another kind of passion and focus. A service to the spirit and an inspiration to the palate. From the skies to the rich earth of Burgundy, he landed in 1980 in Gevrey-Chambertin to begin a career in winemaking with no previous experience. The tenacity and passion proved monumental as he flourished his 2.3ha into 15 growing deep vines into the Santenay gevey, Mazis-Chambertin, Marsannay and Clos de Vougeot. The Guillon empire was expanding and developing into something the world would quickly take notice of.

Jean-Michel found his mentor in the legend Henri Mayer - one of Burgundy's undisputed wine kings. Under his mentorship Guillon adopted the same exacting philosophy to honor the vineyard's terroir by harvesting grapes at their peak ripeness, meticulously sorting them, and employing a gentle, extended maceration process. Fermenting the grapes whole-cluster and age the wine in 100% new oak barrels on every cuvee, hand-selected by M. Jean-Michel Guillon from the most ancient oak trees in some of France's oldest forests. In essence, these wines offer a harmonious blend of elegance and power, a testament to the exceptional expertise and talent of Mr. Guillon and his son Alexis.

Our consignor is a devotee of Guillon and with good reason. Here we have curated 13 lots that are exceptional morsels from Domaine Jean-Michel Guillon et Fils and exemplify the winemaking expertise that won Jean Michel "winemaker of the year" by the Guide Hachette in 2020.

Through the observant and exacting commitment of the consignor- every single bottle was directly purchased from the Domaine and then meticulously stored in a state-of-the-art facility in Washington DC at ideal conditions of 54-56 degrees Fahrenheit. The provenance and loving care have left these bottles in immaculate condition. The following lots comprise half the collection of a wine loving friend who began collecting wine in 1967. Thereafter, most of the wine was purchased at retail upon release, the exceptions being wines pre-1966, also purchased from reliable retailers, many from Young's Market on Long Island. Among the latter is the most beautiful bottle of Cheval Blanc 1947 I have seen in years, which was purchased in 1979. Having amassed a substantial cellar by 1990, most purchasing stopped, except for California wines.

In the 1970s and 1980s the collection was housed in an insulated underground cellar in Connecticut, and from the 1990s forward in an insulated underground cellar at 8,500 feet above sea level in Colorado. On a recent visit we tasted superb bottles of Trotanoy 1979, Gressier Grand Poujeaux 1945, and a marvelously rich and well preserved bottle of Corton-Charlemagne Louis Latour 1985.

There are many rarely seen collectibles here, among them a double magnum and jeroboam of Pichon Lalande 1961 both in original wood, bottles of Grange 1971 and Heitz Martha's 1974, Lafite 1976 in magnum, double magnum, and imperial, Latour 1945, and Latour 1964 in imperial. Many opportunities to relive great experiences, or appreciate highlights of vinous history.

WINE AS ART (LOTS 650-659)

While you can't hang a bottle of wine on the wall, the experience of opening a well cellared bottle of rare wine in good company is as artistic as it comes. And while any good winemaker is measuring levels in labs, the best act as poets in shepherding grapes into the bottle. One plot of land produces grapes that taste like lavender while another grows vines that evoke berries is a mystery scientists can recognize but never fully explain. If you're reading the pages of this catalogue, you already are sold on the idea of wine, from the making to the consuming, as an artform. The consignor is a well-regarded dealer of more "traditional" forms of art from painting to sculpture. As his tastes have changed, he releases these bottles to new connoisseurs who will open and share them. Dominus

After mastering wine production at two of the most esteemed wineries in Bordeaux, Petrus and Château Trotanoy, owner Christian Moueix looked toward Napa Valley to create one of tomorrow's classics in California. In 1982 in partnership with Robin Lail and Marcia Smith, Christian founded Dominus, a proprietary red wine produced in the heart of Napa Valley solely from the historic Napanook vineyard first planted in 1836. With the true understanding of terroir, the soil and climate of the Napanook vineyard at the foot of the Mayacamus Mountains was ideal for Cabernet Sauvignon and this is the base of the blend. The assemblage changes each year with varying degrees of Cabernet Franc, Merlot and Petit Verdot used to retain the consistent structure and complexity of the wine while reflecting the uniqueness of each vintage. A series of artists' portraits of Christian Moueix adorn the labels of the first vintages from the Estate (1983-1990) and then beginning with the 1991 vintage a classic Bordeaux styled label replaced the artist series.

The wines are made from grapes grown solely on the Napanook vineyard, allowing them to have a specific identity. They are "estate bottled" in the spirit of the Bordeaux chateaux and from the time of inception have characterized the expression of terroir in their earthy rusticity and complex character. Dominus exemplifies California production in a classic Bordeaux style.

Unlike most Napa winemakers and vineyard owners, Joseph Phelps did not come to the area to make wine; he arrived when the construction company he ran, Hensel Phelps, won the bid to construct Souverain Winery (now Rutherford Hill). He fell in love with the area and in 1973, purchased the land that became the original part of Joseph Phelps Vineyards. For many years, these vineyards were supplemented with purchased fruit from other top Napa growers, including the famous Eisele Vineyard.

Today, though, in keeping with the longstanding goal of the family to use only estate grown fruit, all but a small amount of Syrah comes from their own holdings. In 1974, Phelps decided to release a wine that profoundly affected the direction of California winemaking, by releasing Insignia, the first Napa wine to blend Bordeaux varieties in the same way as the Bordelais themselves. Insignia is routinely rated as the best of the so-called "meritage" Bordeaux-style blends by critics including Robert M. Parker, Jr. and the Wine Spectator.

Scarecrow

The heart and soul of the Scarecrow cuvee dates back to the late nineteenth century. Born in 1895, J.J. Cohn rose from poverty in Harlem, New York to become the Chief of Production of MGM Studios in California. Cohn purchased a 180-acre estate in Rutherford in the Napa Valley as a retreat for his family. His estate bordered that of the legendary winemaker of Inglenook, Gustave Niebaum. In 1945, Niebaum convinced Cohn to plant eighty acres of Cabernet Sauvignon that he promised to purchase. This would become the base for the distinguished Inglenook Cabernet Sauvignons of the post-war era. It is important to note that these "Old Vines" that are now the hallmark of Scarecrow are still on their original rootstock planted in 1945, unlike most of the grafted rootstock found in Napa that was struck by phylloxera - possibly paying tribute to J.J. Cohn himself who lived to be 100 years old. Paying homage to his grandfather who during his time at MGM was instrumental in the making of film classics such as The Wizard of Oz, Bret Lopez honors J.J. Cohn with the wine that is Scarecrow.

Domaine de la Romanée-Conti

The domaine is known for picking very late, sometimes, as in 1978, later than any other producers. They prune endlessly, make many passes through the vineyards at harvest and sort grapes rigorously both in the vineyard and at the winery. Average age of the vines is around thirty-five to forty-five years with yields typically around thirty hl/ha. The wines are aged in new French oak casks for approximately twenty months. There is usually only one racking and since 1985 the wines from all casks in each cru have been blended together prior to bottling to reduce bottle variation. Recently they have been moving towards biodynamic viticultural practices. Like many of the region's leading growers they have seen concrete evidence of soil and vine health improvement. It's hard to imagine that these wines could get better, but that is what separates them from the rest of the pack: an unrelenting pursuit for perfection in the Pinot Noir grape. In addition to the majestic reds, a white is also produced from a plot in Montrachet.

LEGENDS Part II

The Private Cellar of A.A.G., Six Decades of Collecting

Once again, LEGENDS graces the auction rostrum! Just like the previous offering back in September, this second tranche is true to name.

To recap, the collection you see before you is the product of over 60 years and two generations of father & son collecting the best of the best. The owners approached their collecting with a long-term plan: to buy wines on release and cellar them for the next generation's enjoyment. To have this sort of foresight, at this volume, as early as the 1960s—when Michael Broadbent was only beginning to invent the modern wine auction—is nearly unheard of.

Our consignor's family was buying the 1960s vintages on releases. He bought thousands of cases of 1982 Bordeaux en primeur, back when 1982 Petrus was \$75 and 1982 Mouton was \$32. If you'd had a crystal ball, you could've bought 1974 Heitz, Martha's Vineyard, for \$65.

Indeed, the family either timed it well, or was exceedingly lucky, as the zenith of their buying and collecting coincided with the rise of Robert Parker Jr. on the world's stage and the golden age of fine wine in the United States.

As you will see as you peruse these lots, almost no wines have been added to the collection in

the last 20 years. The wines were bought directly from the chateaux themselves in many cases. They have been temperature-controlled in a commercial wine warehouse owned by the consignor since purchase. The resounding response from purchasers of the previous offerings was uniformly positive—not an “off” bottle amongst the thousands sold.

Highlights include:

Not a case, but another three cases, of the 1959 Latour. A case of 1986 Le Pin. 1948 Cheval Blanc. Two six-pack original wooden cases of 1979 Barolo Bussia di Monforte Riserva from Bruno Giacosa. Case after case of 1997 Barolo by Roberto Voerzio. A twelve-pack original carton of 2000 Richebourg Anne Gros. A full case of 1985 Champagne Charlie.

The list goes on and on and on.

Cheval Blanc has a relatively short history compared with the other top-rank châteaux of Bordeaux. As recently as the 1830s it was still a part of Figeac. A portion of that estate was sold to the Ducasse family, then owners of L'Evangile, and by twenty years later, when a Ducasse married a Fourcard-Loussac, the property was already some thirty-one hectares in size. The estate remained with the Fourcard-Loussac family until part of it was sold to Bernard Arnault and his company, LVMH, in 1998. Today, along with Château d'Yquem, it is fully owned by Arnault and managed by the dynamic Pierre Lurton.

Cheval Blanc, across the road from Pomerol, has distinctive soil makeup: about twenty percent sand, forty percent clay and forty percent gravel. In the gravelly and sandy areas the roots have to work hard to stay alive and often reach depths of seven to eight meters, compared with two to three meters in the clay areas.

Today the roughly thirty-seven hectares of vineyards are planted with sixty percent Cabernet Franc and forty percent Merlot. Yields are typically thirty-five hl/ha, and the annual production of 6500 to 7000 cases is bottled after eighteen to twenty-four months in new oak.

It was even mentioned by Samuel Pepys in his diary entry of April 10,1663, when he was dining at the Royal Oak Tavern in Lombard Street, London: "...and here drank a sort of French wine called Ho Bryan that hath a good and most particular taste I never met with."

The famous Pontac family set up the estate in the first portion of the sixteenth century. Wealthy and well connected, they had the means to promote the wine in fashionable places, and by the early 1700s it was as well known as a wine of the highest quality.

While parts were split off, the estate stayed with the family until it was passed to Joseph Fumel in 1780. He was largely responsible for creating much of what we see today, including the buildings, the gardens and the general layout of the property. He famously hosted a visit from Thomas Jefferson on May 25, 1787, and became Mayor of Bordeaux three years later.

With its popularity waning under a succession of different owners, the estate was finally put up for auction in 1836, where it was purchased by the Larreau family. Two years later, in 1838, they managed to acquire a further piece of the estate previously lost through inheritance laws.

Although it was included as a First Growth in the 1855 classification of Bordeaux, difficult times lay ahead. A further succession of owners and the depression of the early 1930s forced another sale. This time, successful American financier Clarence Dillon stepped up, and for a little under \$200,000 walked away with the estate. It remains in the Dillon family today.

Vineyards, Winemaking and the Delmas Family

No discussion of the wines of Haut-Brion can be complete without a mention of the Delmas family, who have managed the property since 1923—first George Delmas, then his son Jean-Bernard, and today Jean-Philippe. It is not only unusual but also massively fortunate for Haut-Brion to have the care and attention of such a talented family of technical directors.

Jean-Philippe Delmas is a clever, tirelessly devoted man, and the solid support and financial backing of the Dillon family has enabled him and his team to produce an extremely consistent wine. I always look forward to visiting Château Haut-Brion, not just because the wines are superb and the people great, but also because it is unique and has an important place in the history of Bordeaux.

Château Lafite Rothschild

For as long as anyone can remember, Lafite has been the most highly regarded wine in Bordeaux. From their very first book, published in 1845, Cocks & Feret have listed Lafite first, and it was ranked first in the famous 1855 classification of Bordeaux.

Fite is an old French term meaning small hill, rise or mound; it is from this humble feature in Bordeaux' somewhat bland landscape that France's most esteemed producer takes its name. The Château itself is one of the oldest in Bordeaux, with much of it dating from the mid-sixteenth century. It was purchased by the wealthy Ségur family in the seventeenth century, but like much of the region at the time, the land was used for a variety of farming.

Beginning in the 1670s, the Ségurs spent around twenty years converting a large portion of the land to vineyards. With Latour and Calon, as well as Lafite, under their ownership, the Ségurs began to find a market for their wines in London. It was first mentioned in the London Gazette in 1707 and soon became famous: by the early 1730s, it was a favorite of the Prime Minister, Robert Walpole.

Lafite remained in the Ségur family until 1784. It was sold several times, finally to Baron de Rothschild in 1868, by which time there were some seventy-four hectares of vines. It was a new era of industrial wealth and the Rothschild purchase certainly added much celebrity to the area.

Château Latour

Some of my fondest wine memories are of drinking wine
bottles of the renowned Château Latour. It is, without
a doubt, one of the greatest wine estates in the world.
While its history goes well back to the fourteenth century,
Latour began to be clearly defined as one of the greatest
wine estates in the world in the mid-nineteenth century,
and amazingly, It has kept that position for the last 150
years. Their wines, which are known for their power,
richness and longevity, are sought after by collectors and
wine lovers throughout the world.

As Robert M. Parker says of Château Latour in *The
World's Greatest Wine Estates*, "The wine produced here
has been an impeccable model of consistent excellence, in
great, mediocre, and poor vintages. For that reason, many
have long considered Latour to be the Médoc's finest
wine...Latour remains one of the most concentrated, rich,
tannic, and full-bodied wines in the world."

In 2000, I had the wonderful opportunity to taste
over twenty-five vintages of Château Latour, including
fourteen wines older than 1961 and four from the
nineteenth century. It was an evening I will never
forget. The wines were so rich, alive and fresh. What
an extraordinary experience it was to be able to taste
the 1900 and the 1899 side by side and discuss the
differences, or to argue whether the 1955 or the 1949 is
showing better right now (at my table we all thought the
1955 had the slight edge). In the end we tasted Latour
from a 125 year span and although there was a lot of
discussion about which were the better wines, the final
conclusion of everyone in the room was that, "Latour
makes some of the greatest wines that any of us have ever
tasted."

Château Margaux

Perhaps the grandest of the Bordeaux châteaux, Château Margaux is the epitome of style and refinement. At Château Margaux one has truly arrived at the heart and soul of Bordeaux, the world's most renowned wine region.

For centuries before the French Revolution, the château was owned by the Lestonnac family. The revolution, though, saw the estate's owners beheaded, and when the heirs were unable to pay the costs of running the château, Margaux was put up for auction.

The successful bidder, the Marquis de la Colonilla, demolished the old château, and in 1802 work began on the grand château we know today. The Château was sold several times until it was acquired by the Ginestet, longtime shareholders who finally became sole owners in 1949, with the purchase financed by the sale of their St Emilion property, Clos Fortet. However, First Growth châteaux are expensive to run, and to finance the operations of the estate, the owner sold off the vineyards of Dufort Vivens in the 1960s and transferred Cos d'Estournel to his sister in 1971. Even those moves, though, were not enough, and collapse of the Bordeaux market in the early 1970s forced Ginestet to sell the château in 1976 to Greek supermarket magnate Andre Mentzelopoulos. A serious oenophile, he was also a major shareholder in the French wine firm, Nicolas.

Château Mouton Rothschild

While Mouton was always a highly regarded wine, a big change came when in 1922, when the twenty-one-year-old Baron Philippe decided to run the Château full-time. An innovator from the start of his tenure, in 1924 he decided that in order to guarantee quality the entire production would be bottled at the Château, and from 1934 he numbered each bottle released. Also, of course, he started the tradition of works of art on Mouton labels, featuring the famous Carlu ram's head from 1924 to 1926, and since a hiatus from then until 1945, each label has either been designed by a major artist or featured a tribute to a significant event in the Château's history.

Perhaps his most significant achievement was persuading the French Minister for Agriculture, Jacques Chirac, that Mouton was and had always been a First Growth that had been wrongly classified. So, in 1973, for the first and only time, a revised edition of the 1855 classification was released with Mouton finally ranked, next to its Pauillac neighbors Lafite and Latour, as a First Growth.

Petrus

Petrus today is a little over eleven hectares, including five hectares purchased in 1969 from neighboring Château Gazin. The vineyards have clay topsoil and gravelly subsoil, allowing good initial water retention but excellent longer term drainage. The vines are old, around forty to fifty years, planted with ninety percent Merlot and five percent Cabernet Franc. To increase concentration the vines are pruned extensively and a green harvest is performed. At harvest time, nearly two hundred workers pick the grapes at their peak of balance and ripeness. Sometimes up to four passes are needed but if pressed, as in 1982, the entire harvest can be completed in just one day.

The grapes are partially destemmed and after a fairly lengthy maceration period, sometimes almost a month, the wine spends twenty months in new oak before being fined (but not filtered) and bottled. Petrus is a classic example of careful vineyard management and winemaking yet the result leaves evidence of something even greater. These methods combine with exquisite terroir for Merlot to create something that is, in good vintages, not only earth-shatteringly tasty, but distinctive, lending the name Petrus majesty because of its quality but also its inimitability.

Château Angélu

Château Angélu has one of the longer histories in the St Emilion appellation. The de Bouard family has a long history in the region. In fact, the de Bouard family has been in Bordeaux for more than 700 years. They arrived in St Emilion in 1782. However, even though Château Angélu has been around for quite a while, the chateau does not have the same track record as the family. Compared to the current owners, Angélu is mere baby having been born in 1782. That was the year when Georges de Bouard began purchasing vineyard land in the St Emilion area.

Skipping ahead a few hundred years, Catherine de Bouard de Laforest began living at a St Emilion property known as Château Mazerat at the close of the 18th century. The true birth of what we know of as Château Angélu begins in 1909 when Maurice de Bouard de La Forest inherited the vineyard owned by his ancestor. In 1921, Maurice de Bouard de La Forest purchased a 3.5 hectare parcel of vines known as L'Angélu and the estate was born.

Château Angélu is still owned by the de Bouard family. In fact, since 1989, Angélu is considered one of the top estates in the entire Right Bank appellation. Hubert de Bouard is currently in charge of managing the family directed property. Today, all the children participate in running the estate. Prior to his tenure, the truth is, the property was not making wines as good as their terroir allowed.

Shortly after de Bouard began running the property, he instituted another change. He changed the name from L'Angélu to Angélu. He said, "This allows the wine to show up first in alphabetized lists." He was right! Château Angélu was one of the first chateaux to expand into China and Asia. In part, some of their initial success into China was due to their logo of the golden bell, where the wine is referred to as Kin Chung, The Golden Bell. In fact, Hubert de Bouard has always been a savvy marketer. He was one of the first people to connect with Hollywood when he negotiated the addition of Château Angélu into the plot of a James Bond movie!

Château Cos d'Estournel

Château Cos d'Estournel is regarded by many as the finest wine within the northern commune of Saint Estèphe and is certainly an aesthete's delight. Driving past the stately Château Lafite Rothschild with its manicured gardens and willow-trees billowing in the wind, you enter a rollercoaster dip which ascends towards a building that appears to have been designed on LSD with its Chinese pagodas and menagerie of creatures: lions, elephants and unicorns sculpted in sandstone that radiates at sunset. Even the large main door is ornately carved with exotic flora and fauna. What is surprising is that this is not even a place of residence: but simply one of the most outrageously decadent chai in the world.

History

The history of Château Cos d'Estournel is one of the most colourful in Bordeaux and is associated with iconic figures of the nineteenth century.

The word "Cos" derives from Gascogne tongue, meaning "hill of pebbles" whilst its appendage is down to Louis-Gaspard d'Estournel who was born in 1753 and lived to the ripe old age of ninety-one, passing away just two years before his beloved estate was classified as a Second Growth, along with Château Montrose. Louis Gaspard had a penchant for acquiring land, inheriting his first parcel at the tender age of twenty-nine and having acquired a parcel of vines near the village of Cos, he recognized that the terroir was similar to that of Lafite and immediately resolved to create a wine of equal stature. Between 1821 and 1857 he expanded the vineyard piecemeal from twelve to fifty-seven hectares including the best parcel of vines from the neighbouring Château Cos Labory, eventually owning the whole hill.

Château La Conseillante

The wine undergoes a long maceration with the skins, is matured in oak barrels, half of which are renewed each year, and kept twenty to twenty-four months before bottling. It is neither filtered nor, even when it undergoes periodic racking, never pumped. Movement from one receptacle to another is by gravity...The wine resembles Lafleur Petrus rather than Lafleur or Petrus itself in that it is elegant rather than densely structured, perfumed and accessible rather than firm and unforthcoming, delicately rich and refined rather than voluptuously solid. This, I would suggest, is a result of the gravel and sand elements in the soil. What I find exciting about a good Conseillante is its complexity, the depth and concentration of its fruit; above all, its breed. Though it seems to mature faster than some of its more muscular neighbours, the wine is normally impeccably balanced and therefore will certainly keep. As the Conseillante motto has it: 'Faire peu mais fair bon' ('Make little, but make it good'). It deserves its high reputation.

Château La Mission Haut-Brion

Although the histories of Château Haut-Brion and La Mission are entwined, both have always been separate entities, sharing a common family name. It is only since 1983 that they have shared the same proprietor when it was taken over by the owners of Haut-Brion...

Their commitment to innovation and improvements has been a catalyst for many estates in the Graves region to improve their wines, particularly with respect of clonal selection research. In 1987 the old chai was renovated, a new state-of-the-art cuvier was installed and a new bottling line was implemented in 1996. It must be emphasized that the estates are treated as separate entities, even though at some point the vines of both run side-by-side. In 2003 Jean-Bernard retired and handed the reins over to his son, Jean-Philippe Delmas.

Certainly since the arrival of Jean-Bernard Delmas the style of wine has improved: the wine is more pure and the volatile acidity has been eradicated. At its best (the 1966, 1975, 1998) La Mission is a massive, tannic behemoth that has more in common with Château Latour than Château Haut-Brion. It is a powerful, sturdy wine with firm tannins and admirable longevity...

Château Lafleur

Originally part of the Le Gay estate, Lafleur is owned by the Robin family, also owners of Le Gay until 2002. Today Lafleur is managed by Jacques Guinaudeau, a cousin of the owners. The vineyard is just 200 meters from Petrus and although gravelly in appearance, the soils do contain a fair amount of clay. The vines here are fairly old, having largely avoided the 1956 frost, and the yields are low, just twenty-six hl/ha. The grapes are total destemmed, and the wines spend roughly sixteen to twenty months in fifty percent new oak barriques.

This is an extremely rich and heady wine, like liquid velvet, big and muscular when young, but mellowing wonderfully in time. Unfortunately for the many fans of Lafleur, production is a meager 1000 to 1200 cases a year.

The vineyard has humble beginnings. Mme. Loubie owned
the land from 1924 until her passing in March 1979 and
during this time the wine was sold as generic Pomerol.
When Jacques Thienpont purchased the meager
1.6-hectares parcel for one million francs, he named his
wine Le Pin, after a solitary pine tree that shaded the
property. His cousin, Alexandre Thienpont once told me
that Jacques contemplated absorbing the tiny parcel
into Vieux Château Certan in order to supplement the
production, but had a change of heart once it was his
possession, after all quality was already improving at Vieux
Château Certan.

Throughout the 1980s and early 1990s the wine
became an icon of modern Bordeaux. Le Pin was soon
challenging the supremacy of Petrus not only in terms
of price, but in terms of quality. Its scarcity, memorable
name, its understated label, charismatic proprietor and
most importantly quality, provided the rocket fuel for
its meteoric rise into the élite in a handful of years. The
present encepagement is 92% Merlot with just 8%
Cabernet Franc although the final blend is usually 100%
Merlot, similar to Château Petrus.

Château Léoville Las Cases

The château gets its name from the Marquis de Las-Cases Beauvoice who, upon the dividing up of the vast Léoville estate, ended with the largest portion. Hugh Barton bought a quarter, Baron Poyferré (a relative) ended up with another quarter, and the remaining half went to the Marquis.

As debt accumulated during the earlier part of the twentieth century, the estate was gradually acquired by its then manager, Theophile Skavinski. Jean-Hubert Delon, the estate's present owner, is one of his descendents.

The Wine

Although there are nearly 100 hectares under vine here, it is the fifty-three hectares of Grand Clos with that famous wall and arched entrance that is the primary source of fruit for the grand vin. The vines are planted to seventy percent Cabernet Sauvignon, seventeen percent Merlot and thirteen percent Cabernet Franc. Ageing is in sixty-five percent new oak barriques for fifteen to eighteen months, which just goes to show you don't need three and a half years in 100 percent new oak to make great wine. The second wine, Clos du Marquis, was one of Bordeaux' first when the 1902 vintage debuted.

These are serious wines, as good as any in the Médoc and in many years outperforming its second growth status. This estate could be called "the Latour of St Julien," which is actually not very far from the truth as it does reside right next door to the First Growth!

Château L'Evangile

History

By the 1780s the estate, then known as Fazilleau, was already some thirteen hectares (it is fourteen hectares today). Just prior the century's turning it was sold to a lawyer named Isambert, who changed the name to L'Evangile. The estate was up for sale again in 1862, this time bought by Paul Chaperon, and it stayed with his descendants (the Ducasse family) until its purchase by the Rothschilds of Château Lafite in 1990.

The Wine

While not a big producer compared to the chateaux of the Medoc, L'Evangile manages around 5000 cases annually from its fourteen hectares holding. It is a typical Pomerol blend of eighty percent Merlot and twenty percent Cabernet Franc, all of which spends eighteen to twenty-four months in fifty percent new oak barrels.

L'Evangile is a wine of great refinement, poised, focused and with layers ripe silky fruit with a nice hint of graphite and earth.

Château Montrose

Château Montrose is a relatively recent estate compared with its neighbors, but in a very short time rose from woodland to second growth status in the 1855 classification. Since 1945 Montrose has been a star performer and while at times it has been undervalued in the marketplace, today that finally is changing.

History

In 1778 some unused woodland belonging to the Ségur family was sold off and purchased, along with Calon Ségur, by the Dumoulin family. In the early 1800s they began to plant vines, and by 1832 vineyards covered over thirty hectares. Around this time, a small chateau-type building was built and the wine first appeared under the name of Montrose (a name of unknown origin). Though a very young estate, it gained second growth status in 1855, by which time there were almost fifty hectares under vine. It passed to the Charmolue family in 1896, and remains under their ownership.

The Wine

While Montrose was sixty-five hectares in size by the 1890s, unlike many of its peers it has barely grown at all since then and is currently around the sixty-eight hectares mark. The vineyards are planted with sixty-five percent Cabernet Sauvignon, twenty-five percent Merlot and ten percent Cabernet Franc, with annual production of around 25000 cases. Château Montrose is known as a very consistent performer, especially in lesser years when many of its neighbors struggle.

Château Pichon Longueville Comtesse de Lalande

History

Pichon Lalande was originally part of the Pichon Longueville estate, owned by Baron Pichon de Longueville. Upon the Baron's passing in 1850, the estate was divided up among his five children in accordance with the inheritance laws, but only two children actually took possession of the two new estates, and the wines were not made separately for another ten years. When the last of the heirs to what became Pichon Lalande died in 1926 the Château was sold to the Mialhe family, eventually passing to May-Elaine Lenquesaing. A solid performer for much of the century, Pichon Lalande has been one of the top wines of the Médoc since she became involved in the 1970s.

The Wine

Today the seventy-five hectares under vine, planted with forty-five percent Cabernet Sauvignon, thirty-five percent Merlot, twelve percent Cabernet Franc and eight percent Petit Verdot, produce 35,000 cases per year. The vineyards are just north of Latour on fine gravelly soils. I often think the flavours are somewhere between those of Mouton and Latour, and in quality, it can rival any wine in the commune, including the First Growths.

Vieux Château Certan

History

Originally known as Sertan, the chateau was owned by the Demay family from the 1750s until the mid-nineteenth century when a portion of was sold to Charles de Bousquet (another portion is now Certan de May). Cocks & Feret listed VCC first among Pomerol vineyards in their publication of 1868. It remained with de Bousquet until its sale to Georges Thienpont in 1924, a member of a family of successful Belgian merchants who still own VCC, as well as its neighbor Le Pin.

The Wine

The vineyards have gravel topsoil with an iron-rich clay subsoil, perfect for the Merlot and Cabernet Franc which dominate the blend. A little larger than Petrus, the vineyards cover 13.5 hectares producing roughly 5000 cases annually. The grapes, sixty percent Merlot, thirty percent Cabernet Franc and ten percent Cabernet Sauvignon, are totally destemmed prior to fermentation in tank. Following this they then go into 100 percent new oak barriques for eighteen to twenty-two months before fining with egg whites and bottling.

Anne Gros

Domaine Anne Gros is one of several Gros family estates in the village of Vosne-Romanée, with her grandfather having been the famous Louis Gros who passed away in 1951. From Domaine Louis Gros has come four distinct Gros domaines in Vosne-Romanée today, with Anne Gros being the daughter of one of Louis Gros' sons, François. This estate started out as Domaine François Gros when her father first took over his three hectare portion of the family's vineyards and began to bottle his own wines back in 1970, after having worked for several years alongside his brothers and sister at the family domaine. In 1978, health problems forced François Gros to cut back on his workload and his wines were then sold off in barrel to négociants for a full decade, until his only daughter, Anne, was ready to take over direction of the estate. At this point in time, it became Domaine Anne et François Gros, and since 1995, all of the wines here have simply been labeled as Domaine Anne Gros, to try to reduce confusion with the wines produced by her cousin Anne-Françoise Gros.

The estate has expanded a bit since the original three hectares of vines that François began with in 1970, and today the domaine owns 6.5 hectares of vines in the villages of Vosne-Romanée, Vougeot and Chambolle-Musigny. Domaine Anne Gros is interesting in that it has no Premier Cru vineyards, with its two village wines of Chambolle-Musigny "la Combe d'Orveau" and Vosne-Romanée "les Barreaux" augmented by fully three Grand Crus- an extremely old vine Clos Vougeot (vines planted in 1905), a fine example of Echézeaux and an aristocratic Richebourg. The style of Anne Gros' wines are quintessential Vosne-Romanée, with a certain plummy opulence beautifully tied to the underlying soils of the respective vineyards and the wines treated to a generous dollop of toasty new oak up and down the range. While Madame Gros is most famous for her three rich and opulent Grand Crus, her village wines have consistently impressed as being of fine Premier Cru quality and offer up excellent value. Today, Domaine Anne Gros is one of the most famous and sought after estates in the fabled village of Vosne-Romanée.

Domaine Mortet

Charles Mortet founded his domaine in 1956 with a single hectare of vines, to which his son Denis added parcels in a number of vineyards in and around Gevrey-Chambertin. After Denis' tragic death in 2006, his son Arnaud took full control of the now 11.2 hectare domaine, ably carrying on Denis' dream of making refined, elegant wines. Arnaud's wines are reaching new levels, as the winemaker looks back to more traditional viticulture techniques. Machines are no longer used in any sites; everything is done by hand here, and horses are now employed to plough all 1er and Grand Cru vineyards in order to minimize soil compaction. He keeps the yield very low, uses gentler macerations and a smaller percentage of new oak, and has increased the severity of fruit selection. A perfectionist by nature, and driven by a desire to honor his father's legacy, Arnaud is making superbly finessed and precise wines, as he continues to evolve this domaine.

Dominique Laurent

Dominique Laurent has been producing Burgundy since the 1989 vintage, and this former pastry chef has applied the same standards of precision necessary for pastry to the production of fine Burgundy. He purchases wine immediately after fermentation from trusted growers, strongly preferring to work with low yields and extremely old vines. In addition to care in selection of the wine, he was dissatisfied with the quality of the oak barrels available so founded his own cooperage in 1999. While he famously pioneered the use of "200 percent new oak" in Burgundy—that is, during elevage the wines are racked from one new barrel to another new one, to help them continue to add body, richness and tannin for aging—this technique is in fact used only for the very top wines, which have the richness and density appropriate to absorb the treatment and achieve the longevity he is seeking.

Emmanuel began working with his uncle Henri (that's Henri Jayer of course) in the early 1980s. From 1985 he began releasing wines under his own label. Joseph Roty

Since 1710 the family has been based in Gevrey. The current 'reputation' of Domaine Joseph Roty was down to Joseph himself, not just the comments of Remington and Clive, but also the quality of domaine's highly sought-after wines, wines mainly produced from old and in some cases some very, very old vines – très vieilles vignes if you prefer!

Joseph started the core of today's domaine in the late 1960s with vines that came from his grandfather, vines that included Mazy (they spell like Rousseau), Griotte and Charmes-Chambertin Grand Crus.

Joseph was lost to this world in 2008, and although widow Roty still works behind the scenes, it is the sons of Joseph – Philippe and Pierre-Jean – the eleventh generation at this family domaine that do the heavy stuff while a twelfth generation are playing in the yard. Philippe had anyway been working progressively more with his father since about 1990 – there is very little that has been changed.

Arnaud Ente

Founded in 1992, Arnaud Ente is a relative newcomer to the world of fine Burgundy. His wines have been a hot commodity for those that were aware of them; it's only fairly recently that they have been trickling into the auction market, commanding the prices that one of the finest wines in the world deserves. These are micro-production wines made with an intense focus on quality. Arnaud and his wife Marie Odile make wines from En L'Ormeau Clos in Meursault, and bottle them as Meursault, Clos des Ambres, and Sève du Clos, based on vine age and position in the Clos. Ente also makes Puligny-Montrachet Goutte d'Or, Les Referts, and Les Petits Charrons. All of their holding are less than a hectare, and indeed most are a quarter of a hectare—an unfathomably small parcel of wine (to give you an idea, the entirety of Montrachet is 8 hectares). The rarity of these wines is such that demand already outstrips supply, and as Ente's fame continues to grow it would be smart to get in now—not exactly on the ground floor, but nowhere near the top, either.

Jean-Noël Gagnard

Jean-Noël is now well into his retirement, but still finds plenty enough to do, to warrant slipping into his boiler-suit and heading into the cellar. He inherited the domaine from his parents in 1960, when the vines were split between him and his brother Jacques. Jean-Noël made several vineyard acquisitions and also began domaine bottling – the fruits of the domaine's labour were previously sold to the négoce.

Since 1989, Jean-Noël's daughter, Caroline Lestimé took over day-to-day running of the domaine. Caroline had studied business in Paris, and for the first year she divided her attention between managing the commercial aspects of the estate while attending the Beaune Lycée Viticole to learn about viticulture, and Dijon University to learn about oenology. One of her early changes was to increase the number of white wine cuvées since her father's time by introducing a terroir-based policy of separating-out the different vineyards where wines were previously amalgamated under, for instance, a bigger Morgeots cuvée. The domaine now commercializes 9 hectares of vines; one Grand Cru, nine white and two red Chassagne-Montrachet 1ers and a Santenay 1er Clos Tavannes red. Villages and Hautes-Côtes de Beaune are also included.

Caroline explains that her vines are managed in a lutte raisonnée way, and the soil is more biodynamically managed. Claude Bourguignone is retained to make assessments of the soil to ensure that the domaine's approach progresses. Claude, however, doesn't just look at the soil, but also the roots – down or sideways etc. In the cellar Caroline barrel ferments all her whites, often with a short three to four week period of batonnage before ageing them for up to eighteen months in oak casks – only about a third of which will be new – the wines may be bottled with a light filtration if necessary. The whole approach is tailored to emphasize elegance and minerality, which Caroline says was also the goal of her father.

This is a very fine address for Chassagne-Montrachet.

Château Beaucastel

Beaucastel's history dates back to 1549 when "Noble Pierre de Beaucastel" bought a barn with its land holdings, containing twenty-five saumees at Coudoulet. More than four centuries later, this remarkable domaine, known today as Château de Beaucastel, has been producing what some acknowledge to be the finest wines of Châteauneuf-du-Pape. In 1953 Jacques Perrin, son of chemical engineer and mathematics professor Pierre Perrin, took over the domaine and introduced many innovations such as improved grape varieties, integrated pest control (after experiencing the ravages of phylloxera), and a flash-heat exchanger.

The vineyards of Beaucastel are treated as a garden: no chemical fertilizer, no chemical weed killers or sprays are permitted. Organic fertilizer comes from compost and only a minimum of traditional sulfur-copper spray is used in the vineyards. At extremely low yields, each variety is harvested separately to ensure optimum maturity. All grapes are picked by hand, de-stemmed, and flash-heated to transfer aromas and color while avoiding additional sulfur dioxide.

Each varietal is vinified separately to maintain its own character and originality. Each variety is carefully tasted before blending, and then transferred to large oak barrels for 1 ½ years of aging. Without being fined or filtered, these blends need to be decanted after only a few years in the bottle.

Since 1978, Jacques Perrin's sons, Jean Pierre and François, have been at the helm and beginning in 1989 in very exceptional years they produce a special cuvee in honor of their father. The Château de Beaucastel Hommage à Jacques Perrin is a special selection of the best of a great vintage, yielding small quantities of intensely ripe and concentrated wines.

Henri Bonneau

Without question he is one of the world's great wine makers. He follows no path other than that set by his own intuition. Born in 1938 he comes from a long line of wine growers (twelve generations worth).

He started young and made his first wines in 1956 and the tender age of just eighteen. Since then he has gone on to become a guru in his field.

Very, very old vine Grenache is at the heart of his wines. They are made in a traditional way, perhaps unchanged from the nineteenth century. Now new barrels, in fact the youngest barrels will already be over a decade in age.

He bottles when he feels the wines are ready and releases them when he needs the funds. Nothing here is done in any sense of urgency, old school would be the understatement of the year.

The wines however are about as good as they come. Dense, earthy and incredibly concentrated, yet with time, they unfold into some of the greatest wines ever made. Indeed they are the stuff of legend.

Total holdings amount to roughly six hectares, split into a number of cuvees. Henri changes what is released and made vintage to vintage depending what mother nature gives him. He is a true one off and his wine some of the greatest ever made, period.

Tsar Alexander II wanted a more impressive label to show his guests, and in 1876 he made a special order for the first transparent Cristal bottles, which at that time actually were made of genuine crystal... in the 1930s...Camille Olry-Roederer

took the helm. She invested the money earned from sales in some exceptional vineyards: in Ay, Hautvillers, Cumières, Louvois, Verzy, Verzenay, Vertus, Avize, Cramant, Chouilly, and Le Mesnil. Roederer also owns several well-respected vineyards in other locations: Roederer Estate, Ramos Pinto, Haut-Beauséjour and Château de Pez. Today the firm is the most financially successful in the region, thanks largely to these vineyards, which supply Roederer with some seventy percent of its grapes. The house is now run by Jean-Claude Rouzaud who works according to the same principles as those applied in past decades... Roederer is without doubt a brilliant Champagne house with an exceptional portfolio of wines. The non-vintage Champagne is brilliant. The Rosé and Blanc de Blancs offer an aristocratic elegance typical of the house, and the vintage wine is always among the best. Cristal is today the most sought-after cuvée de prestige, and has perhaps the most appetizing appearance of any wine in the world. Cristal Rosé is not only the most expensive rosé Champagne—it is obviously the best. In my opinion, this house is one of the four best in all of Champagne. Every vintage is stunning.

Aldo Conterno

In the nineteenth century, the forefathers of Aldo Conterno emigrated to Argentina, but on account of various family vicissitudes they returned to Italy after a few years. It was then that Giovanni Conterno brought his family back to the small winemaking farm of his father Giuseppe in Monforte d'Alba and started helping him in the production of local wine. In response to market demand, the Conternos then felt the need to create a superior Barolo, to be produced exclusively from the best vintages, with a long vinification period and capable of lasting over time; thus, in the 1920s the first Barolo reserve was bottled.

Aldo Conterno's cru vineyards (Romirasco, Cicala and Colonnello) located in Bussia di Monforte d'Alba, portray the real expression of Langa terroir. The wine of this cru gives itself with firm determination by playing on the most classical elements of Nebbiolo vine and its spicy notes give a crystal idea of the uniqueness of this soil.

Bruno Giacosa

Bruno Giacosa was born in the town of Nieve, within the Barbaresco DOCG. As young as thirteen Bruno was assisting his father and grandfather in the cellars, and by the age of fifteen he was fully employed in the family firm. Bruno's grandfather, Carlo Giacosa, started the firm in the late nineteenth century when the wine was sold in demi-johns and not estate bottled. It was not until the 1960s that the Giacosas began to sell more wine in bottle than in demi-john!

Up until 1964 the family did not offer any individual cru bottlings of either Barbaresco or Barolo, and following tradition in the region, they were labeled simply as Barolo or Barbaresco. It is noted that even as far back as Carlo Giacosa's time, the wines were vinified and kept separately in the cellars. The two vineyards which they primarily purchased from at that time, the Gallina and Santo Stefano, were only blended together for the Barbaresco "Riserva Speciale" and therefore all regular Barbaresco bottlings were in effect two distinct Barbarescos released under the same label.

Like so many of the top producers in Piedmont, the Giacosas did not own any of the vineyards from which they made their wines. In 1982, they finally purchased a vineyard holding of their own, the 8.4 hectare Falletto vineyard in the village of Serralunga. This purchase in Barolo was followed up more than a decade later when the Giacosa family bought pieces in two of the greatest terroirs in Barbaresco, the Asili and Rabaja vineyards, in time to produce bottlings of the 1996 vintage.

The style of Giacosa's wines are quite traditional, though the fermentations are not quite as long as many of their neighbors of the "old school". Typically the maceration will now last from fourteen to twenty-four days for the Barbarescos and Barolos, which is quite a bit shorter than a producer such as Giuseppe Mascarello, whose Barolo Monprivato macerates for at least thirty days (down from sixty days in years past). Following this maceration the wines are racked into large casks called botti and aged for three to four years. The control of the winery is now in the capable hands of daughter Bruna Giacosa and Cellarmaster Dante Scaglione.

There are no wines that match the prestige or class of Giacosa's in all of Barbaresco and only a select few which share the crown in Barolo.

Gaja

In the mid-nineteenth century Giovanni Gaja established the winery and Angelo, the fourth generation, joined the family firm in 1961. Angelo Gaja, born in 1940 and the present director of the family firm, has a degree in enology from Alba as well as a masters in economics. In 1974 he went to California, where he presumably fell under the spell of the barrique. Gaja has achieved unequivocal success aging his Barbarescos in small, new oak barrels, where the wine takes on a certain subtlety and suppleness without losing the personality of the Nebbiolo grape.

Gaja is the largest private owner of vineyards in the Barbaresco zone, with 153 acres of vines in Barbaresco, Treiso, and Alba. They own fourteen different vineyards in Barbaresco and Treiso that make up their Barbaresco normale. Besides this regular Barbaresco, Gaja bottles three individual crus. Of the three, Costa Russi matures the soonest. It is the most open, with a sweeter taste and more intense aroma. Sori Tildin is more closed and concentrated; it is firm in texture and holds more in reserve. Sori San Lorenzo is the hardest of all in its youth, requiring age to show its real quality. It is the slowest maturing of the crus as well as the longest lived.

Giacomo Conterno

Cantine Giacomo Conterno has stood at the pinnacle of "traditionalist camp of Barolo" for many, many decades, and along with the wines of other Piemonte icons such as Bartolo Mascarello, Mauro Mascarello and Bruno Giacosa, the wines of Cantine Giacomo Conterno have set the standard for excellence in the region for many years. The founder of the estate as it stands today was Giacomo Conterno, who began his own winery in the village of Monforte d'Alba in 1920, and quickly earned a reputation for excellence for the quality of his Barolo. However, the Conterno family's involvement in wine production in Barolo far predates the launching of today's winery in 1920, as the family retains documentation of their wine production ties that dates back to 1770. And in fact, Giacomo Conterno's father was very much involved in winemaking and wine sales from the moment he began his businesses in the region at the beginning of the twentieth century. The flagship Barolo bottling here is the bodega's Monfortino Riserva Speciale, which was first made in the 1920 vintage, and which is unequivocally one of Piemonte's longest-lived and greatest wines.

In many respects, modern Barolo as a long-lived and cellar-worthy wine owes much of its heritage to the visionary efforts of Giacomo Conterno throughout the decades of the 1920s, 1930s and 1940s. It is rather hard to imagine the landscape of Barolo as it is today without his pioneering efforts.

Roberto Voerzio

The Voerzio winery was established in 1986 in La Morra, a town in the heart of the Langhe that has always been renowned for the greatness of its vineyards, some of which were mentioned in town records going back as far as 1250. From an original two hectares the winery has managed to acquire plots in the most prestigious, historic crus for the production of Barolo, such as La Serra, Brunate, Cerequio, Sarmassa, Rocche dell'Annunziata and Fossati, and excellent vineyards for Dolcetto, Barbera, Nebbiolo and Merlot.

Voerzio proudly works in the traditional way in the cellar, with total simplicity at every stage from vinification to bottling, with no interference, letting the diversity of each terroir emerge and giving each vineyard the chance to make its own wine. Production is limited: with just over twenty hectares production is between 40,000 to 60,000 bottles, depending on the harvest. No substances that can alter the characteristics of the wine (increasing the colour, structure, scent or tannins etc.), are used in any of the various processes in the cellar.

Vega Sicilia

Vega Sicilia, often called "the Lafite of Spain" for its elegance, is among the oldest extant wineries in Spain and remains among its most celebrated. Toribio Lecanda purchased 2,000 acres of farmland from the Marquis de Valbuena in 1848, but it was not until 1864 that his son, Eloy, began to convert it to viticulture by planting Cabernet Sauvignon, Malbec and Pinot Noir. Originally, he made brandy, and even before it was a winery Vega Sicilia was appointed to be the brandy supplier to the royal family of Spain. Vega Sicilia Único ("unique") and Valbuena both date from 1915, when the vineyards had recovered sufficiently from phylloxera to permit great wine to be made. Único, made only in outstanding years, is typically mostly Tempranillo, with the balance Cabernet Sauvignon, Malbec and Merlot. It spends at least seven years in barrel, and at least three in bottle, before release, and in some vintages, it is aged for astonishingly long periods before it reaches the market. The 1970, for example, was not released until 1995, and magnums did not follow until 2000!

The wine lives up to its designation as "unique." It is intensely fragrant, complex on the palate but also extremely concentrated, with very high acidity to balance the richness. Occasionally, the winery will release a small quantity of wine designated "Reserva Especial," a blend of two or three Únicos; these bottlings are generally considered to be of the same high quality as the single vintage releases.

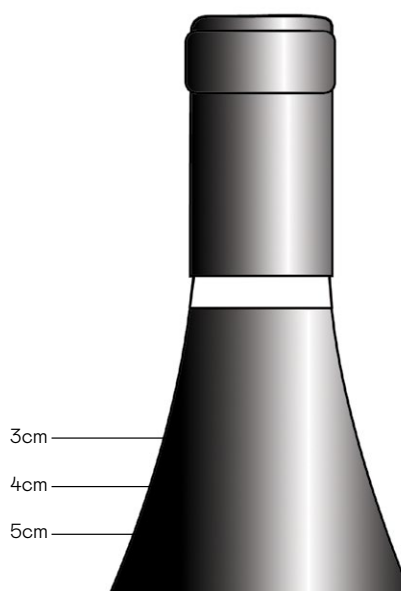
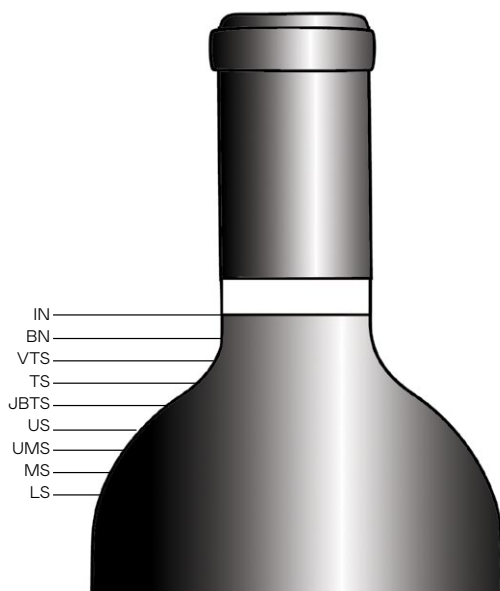

Level/Ullage Descriptions & Interpretations

- IN **Into Neck:** Excellent for a wine of any age.
- BN **Bottom Neck:** Excellent for a wine of 10 years or older.
- VTS **Very Top Shoulder:** Normal for any wine 10 years or older.
- TS **Top Shoulder:** Normal for any wine 25 years or older.
- JBTS **Just Below Top Shoulder:** Normal for any wine 30 years or older.
- US **Upper Shoulder:** Slight natural reduction through easing of cork and evaporation through cork and capsule. Very good for any wine over 40 years old. Excellent for any wine over 50 years of age.
- UMS **Upper-Mid Shoulder:** Good for any wine 50-60 years of age.
- MS **Mid Shoulder:** Probably some weakening of the cork. Very good for wines over 50-60 years of age. Estimates usually take this into account.
- LS **Low Shoulder:** Some weakening of cork acceptable if wine or label is exceptionally rare or interesting.

Because of the slope of shoulder, it is impractical to describe levels of Burgundy-shaped bottles as into neck, etc. Wherever appropriate, the level between capsule and wine will be measured and cataloged in centimeters.

The condition and drinkability of Burgundy are less affected by ullage than its equivalent from Bordeaux. For example, a 5 to 7cm. ullage in a 50 year old Burgundy can be considered normal, indeed good for that age; and 3.5 to 4cm., excellent for that age.

Champagne bottle measurements are done from the bottom of the foil to the level of the wine.

Label & Capsule Conditions

Labels and capsules can become soiled, stained, or otherwise marked, especially with wines over 20 years of age. Unless otherwise noted, label conditions will be appropriate for age, but Buyers should note that normal staining, discoloration or other conditions may not be noted if such conditions are appropriate for the age of the label. Potential Buyers are invited to make appointments to inspect wines personally.

Special Notices

Though every effort is made to describe or measure the levels of older vintages, corks over 20 years old begin to lose their elasticity and levels can change between cataloguing and sale.
